



Things to know:

- Workshop usually start at 10am and run until 12noon or 2pm
- We have no parking so coaches drop off at the front door
- Usually there is only one school in the Museum at a time
- We can take up to 3 classes at a time depending on the workshop
- We have space both indoors and outside for lunch
- We have a lovely shop with items related to our workshops, we recommend around £3 - £4
